

<b>Age</b>	<b><u>Gross Motor</u></b>	<b><u>Fine Motor</u></b>	<b><u>Speech/Communication</u></b>
<b>3 months</b>	Bring head up to 90 degrees while on tummy. Bear weight through arms while on tummy. Begin rolling front to back.	Bring hands together while laying on back. Keep hands open most of the time. Visually track people or objects.	Baby will cry, smile, and coo. Respond to voices. Have the ability to calm when picked up or comforted.
<b>6 months</b>	Roll from back to front and front to back. Begin sitting with support. Bear weight through both legs when supported in standing position.	Grasp and hold a small block. Pick up a rattle. Grasp a string to pull a toy.	Smile and laugh. Cry when upset. Will move arms and legs with excitement. Makes lots of different, playful sounds (babbling).
<b>9 months</b>	Get into sitting position without help. Sit unsupported. Maintain balance while reaching for toys. Use arms to move body forward (army crawling or hands and knees crawling). Begin to pull up to standing position.	Bring hands together to hold a block. Pick up 2 blocks and bang them together. Transfer a toy from one hand to the other. Pick up 2 small items from a table using a raking motion.	Babbles. Has at least 4 different sounds. Plays peek-a-boo. Responds to their name. Reacts to voices (friendly, angry, loud).
<b>12 months</b>	Crawl on hands and knees (5 feet). Pull to standing position using an object for support. Take 4 alternating steps forward with hand held support. Maintain balance in standing position for 5 seconds without support.	Clap hands. Pick up a small object with thumb and forefinger and drop it into a cup. Put block into a container. Remove both socks. Finger feeds self. Assists with putting clothes on and off.	Imitates faces such as sticking out tongue. Begins to say "mama" or "dada". Shows affection. Repeats same sounds often. Babbles that sound like real speech. Makes eye contact.
<b>15 months</b>	Walk 5 steps without support. Stand up from floor without support. Crawl up stairs on hands and knees. Corral a ball with arms/ hands when rolled to child. Throws a small ball in any direction.	Open a book. Turn a container over to dump toys. Begin using eating utensils. Make scribbles on a paper. Pick up 2 cubes with 1 hand and hold them.	Uses a few words. Understands "no". Waves 'bye-bye'. Plays pat-a-cake. Imitates familiar words.
<b>18 months</b>	Walk independently. Crawl backwards down steps. Walk up steps with support from a rail. Walk backwards. Kick a ball in any direction.	Stack 2-3 blocks. Place 2 shapes into correct holes in a shape sorter toy. Grasp a marker with thumb and first finger when coloring. Uses a spoon. Drink from an open cup with some assistance.	Points to body parts. Makes animal sounds. Understands 1 step instructions. Uses 10 to 20 different words. Recognizes pictures of familiar persons and objects.
<b>2 years</b>	Run. Walk sideways.	Turn 3 pages in a book. Place 3 shapes correctly into a	Uses words to communicate wants and needs (milk, more, up).

<b>3 years</b>	<p>Jump forward suing 2 foot takeoff and landing. Walk up steps with 1 foot on each step without support from a rail. Walk 8 feet on tip-toes. Stand on one foot for 3 seconds. Catch a ball. Begin to ride a tricycle.</p>	<p>Remove a screw on lid from a bottle. Stack 6 blocks. Snip paper with scissors. String two beads. Draw a circle. Use a mature grasp on a writing utensil. Feed self with a spoon and fork.</p>	<p>Has 450 words. Can tell you their name. Holds up fingers to tell their age. Has 2-3 word sentences. Refers to themselves as "I" or "me". Names pictures. Matches 3-4 colors. Answers 'where' questions.</p>
<b>4 years</b>	<p>Walk down steps with one foot on each step without support from a rail. Stand on one foot for 5 seconds. Hop forward on one foot. Throw overhand and hit a target from 5 feet. Ride a tricycle or a bike.</p>	<p>Cuts paper into 2 pieces. Draw a cross (t). Trace a horizontal line. Button and unbutton clothes. Put simple puzzles together. Undress independently. Drink from an open cup without spilling.</p>	<p>Has 900 or more words. Says 4-5 word sentences. Knows their name, gender, street they live on. Repeats nursery rhymes. Counts. Can identify and sort colors. Uses proper grammar most of the time. Can stay with one activity for 8-9 minutes.</p>
<b>5 years</b>	<p>Skip, hop, and gallop. Walk forward and backward on a balance beam. Complete 3 sit ups. Run, jump, and climb without difficulty. Perform a somersault.</p>	<p>Draw a square. Cut out a square. Cut along a line. Touch each finger to thumb. Fold a paper in half with edges parallel. Color between vertical lines. Draw a person with 3-4 body parts.</p>	<p>Speaks in 5-6 word sentences. Asks "who" and "why" questions. Tells stories. Matches and sorts objects. Understands past, present, and future tense. Uses all speech sounds correctly with the possible exception of /v/, /l/, /th/, /ch/, /j/, /s/, /z/, and /r/. Asks questions to get information.</p>
